


**WHERE DOES THE ISWM
SERVICE PROVIDER FIT?**

HQ AETC is scheduled to award an Indefinite Delivery, Indefinite Quantity (IDIQ) contract to include all AETC bases by 1 Oct 2009. The intent of the IDIQ is to obtain qualified service providers to execute the ISWM concept. In doing so, the potential exists for service providers to obtain financial incentives for the recycling portion of the program. All installations have untapped recyclable resources. By working together with the installation, the service provider can help us meet our diversion goals and benefit from recyclables revenue.

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WHAT IS ISWM?

ISWM is the combination of two traditional CE service programs:

- Refuse
- Recycling

Integrating the two programs is DoD policy.

- DoD ISWM Policy, 1 Feb 2008
- DoDI 4715.4, Pollution Prevention, 18 Jun 1996
- Executive Order 13423, "Strengthening Federal Environmental, Energy, and Transportation Management," 24 Jan 2007

The Air Force proposal for implementing ISWM is to incorporate Resource Management (RM) .

Unlike traditional solid waste service contracts, RM compensates waste contractors based on performance in achieving the base's waste reduction goals rather than the volume of waste disposed.

Resource Management benefits include:



- Reduction in landfill fees
- Waste to energy conversion
- Reduction, recycling, and reuse
- Revenue source

In the ISWM construct, a single service provider will be utilized to run both programs with the recycling service becoming the primary focus.

WHY ISWM NOW?

One of the reasons HQ AETC is seeking innovative ISWM solutions is the reduction in available funding for facilities operations. Areas considered for offsetting the reduced funding are:

- Minimizing number of dumpsters
- Minimize pickup frequency
- Incorporate service provider recommendations
- Divert as much as possible
 - By recycling, composting, etc.

Another reason is contract administration. As the AF shifts to regionalized contract centers, fewer contracting officers will be available for administration. Resource Management provides an avenue to potentially reduce the number of contracts by combining the refuse and recycling programs.



IMPLEMENTING ISWM

In implementing the DoD's policy on ISWM, the following will be addressed:

- Recycle all mandatory recyclable materials
- Maximize optional materials recycling
- Require all organizations to participate in recycling program & provide education to the public
- Obtain all revenue from DRMO recyclables
- Realize solid waste reduction goals and accurately report solid waste diversion data
- Use recycling proceeds to pay program costs
- Minimize recycling operating costs
- Perform cost benefit analysis
